Boozhoo (Hello),

The Ojibwe Bands of Wisconsin won a significant victory on Tuesday of this week when District Court Judge Barbara Crabb ruled that the Bands can regulate their off-Reservation night deer hunting activities as proposed. The ruling brings to a close a series of ongoing litigation spanning the last several years. Read on for the complete story.

Tribes Win Huge Victory in Night Hunt Case

Ojibwe (Chippewa) Tribal members have been hunting at night with the aid of light for centuries.

And although the practice has continued, Tribal members have been prohibited from doing so outside of their Reservation boundaries for nearly a hundred years.

U.S. District Court Judge Barbara Crabb, Western District, ruled yesterday that the six Chippewa Bands in Wisconsin will be allowed to hunt whitetail deer outside of their northern Wisconsin Reservations. The ruling came down shortly after 4:30 pm central time on Tuesday.



The ruling was a significant victory for the Ojibwe, who sought to re-open the case from 1991 in which Crabb ruled against the Tribes. At that time, Crabb said the state proved that night hunting would pose a safety risk to the general public.

The Tribes moved the Court to allow them to hunt deer at night after the State sanctioned a night hunt for wolves. That, coupled with the state of Wisconsin's previously sanctioned night hunting of diseased and problematic deer, compelled the Tribes to petition the Court. Sighting no significant change in circumstances, Crabb denied the Chippewa Bands' motion for relief in late 2013.

After appealing to the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals in Chicago in 2014, a three judge panel agreed with the Tribes and overturned the lower Court's decision, sending the case back to Crabb and the District Court.

In 2015, the U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear the State's appeal in the case, thus ending the State's remedies.



In her ruling yesterday, Crabb sided with every aspect of the Tribes' case, citing that in "24 years of state experience with night hunting, the Tribes have been able to show that the prohibition on off-Reservation night deer hunting is no longer necessary for public safety purposes, when properly regulated." Crabb said the Tribes successfully argued that the State demonstrated night hunting can be done with little to no risk to the public's safety.

There were several main points addressing the safety of the general public which are built into the proposed rules and regulations for a Tribal member to hunt deer at night. The Tribes' safety plan includes rigorous safety precautions such as hunter training certifications and regulations governing when and where hunters can shoot.

The Great Lakes Fish and Wildlife Commission and Wisconsin DNR will monitor the hunting season, which will run from November 1st through January 30th of each year.

"Many of us have been night hunting since we were children, taught by our parents and grandparents," said Red Cliff Tribal Chairman Bryan Bainbridge. "As Indian people, we're quite cognizant of the health, safety and welfare of not only our own people but the environment as well. I think this ruling says a lot about who we are and the thought and consideration we give to the future. Judge Crabb agreed with each part of our hunting plan because it is so comprehensive and thorough," added Bainbridge.

Ojibwe Tribal leaders across the state believe the hunting plan, including the shooter certification, demonstrates a level of cooperation beyond reproach. No other state sanctioned hunt has as many safety mechanisms or standards.

The new off-Reservation night hunting season is slated to begin November 1st.

Fisheries Department New Research Vessel



The Red Cliff Fisheries Department recently purchased a 1947 Marinette fishing tug from Muskegon, MI. Over the next year, the plan is to strip down the 36 foot vessel and retool it so it can begin a new chapter as the Department's research vessel. The purchase and redesign of the fishing is funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) through a proposal the Tribe wrote. The

project proposed to supply research and enforcement vessels to the Red Cliff, Bad River, Keweenaw Bay and Grand Portage Bands of Ojibwe (Chippewa).

In recognition of the responsibilities the Tribes have in managing commercial and subsistence fishing on Lake Superior, the BIA awarded the project funding to all four Tribes in October 2014.

Treaty Natural Resources Division Administrator Chad Abel says the rehabilitation of the vessel will strengthen the Tribes position as a leader in natural resource protection and conservation.

"This is just one of the many projects we currently have underway. The boat will aid in fisheries research and enforcement, and definitely strengthens the Tribes sovereignty," said Abel. "It also helps in developing and maintaining government to government relationships with the others Bands and the state of Wisconsin," he added.







JOB SUMMARY: This position will support the management, planning and daily activities of Minobimaadiziiwin Gitigaanin (Red Cliff community farm) and assist the Tribe overall with integrated food system planning. The incumbent will explore the marketability, profitability, and community impact of developing tribal food products at the local level. The position will also seek to improve tribal access to locally produced, nutritional foods by involving existing programs and services and by seeking additional support and funding where the need is identified. Creation of a Farm Management Plan through a thoughtful, community-engaged process will be an important starting point for this newly created position.

JOB DUTIES:

1. Explore funding opportunities to further the farm and Tribe's mission of better utilizing and promoting locally and tribally produced foods
2. Investigate marketable production opportunities to increase the revenue potential of tribal food production
3. Oversee daily farm operational needs and perform chores (weeding, pruning, feeding)
4. Function as a conduit between the Garden Committee, TNR Division and Planning Administrator in food sovereignty planning efforts
5. Recommend farm expansion initiatives through the development phase of a Farm Management Plan
6. Supervise interns and seasonal staff
7. Maintain records of farm inputs, harvest volume, cost of production, and success of pilot projects
8. Develop programs to engage tribal youth and encourage small-scale agricultural research projects
9. Increase access to local food staples for the overall benefit of the tribal community
