Off-Reservation Night Hunt Safety Course

Attention off-Reservation Red Cliff Tribal and 1837/1842 Treaty Night Hunters.

Pursuant to the recent U.S. District Court ruling, off-Reservation Tribal night hunters will be required to demonstrate marksmanship proficiency before obtaining a night hunting permit. The test requires that eight of 10 rounds fired come within 6 and 1/4 inches from bulls eye at a distance of 100 yards at night. You must also test using the gun you will use for your hunting activities.

This course will be held on Friday, October 23, 2015 beginning at 9:00 am in Bad River at the Bad River Housing Authority.

Sessions Set for Night Hunt Training and Marksmanship Test

The Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission will be holding a mandatory off-Reservation Treaty night hunt training and marksmanship certification course.

Tribal members interested in the off-Reservation Treaty night hunt must first attend a required 12-hour advanced hunter safety course and pass a marksmanship test at night. Tribal members belonging to the

Tribes which are party to the Treaty of 1842 and the Treaty of 1837 may attend any training session listed below.

Safety course and testing sessions are scheduled as follows:

Wednesday, October 21 - 9:00 am to 10:30 pm at the Mole Lake Lodge and Conference Center.

Friday, October 23 - 9:00 am start at the Bad River Housing Authority.

Saturday, October 24 - 9:00 am start; Lac du Flambeau location TBD.

Sunday, October 25 - 9:00 am start at the Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwe Community College auditorium. Food will be provided at this session.

Monday, October 26 - 9:00 am start; St. Croix location TBD.

Participants must bring their own light, ammunition and weapon intended to be used during the night hunt. Equipment must be clean and sighted-in.

There will be breaks to eat, but food will not be provided at all of the sessions.




