Great Lakes Intertribal Epidemiology Center – Epidemiologist Data Focused

Responsibilities include carrying out a broad range of epidemiologic activities including: collection, analysis and interpretation of Tribal and State collected health information; technical assistance to Tribes on a variety of epidemiological issues and upon request; and training in relation to collecting and using health information. Analyzes and interprets data from various sources. Compiles reports, charts and tables based on established statistical methods for both internal and external sources. Responds to and resolves specialized computer and IT issues within GLITEC.

Working out of the Lac du Flambeau Central Office in Lac du Flambeau, WI, this position is full-time with benefits including; Annual/Personal Leave and Holiday Pay; Health, Dental, Life & AD&D, STD and LTD Insurance, FSA and 403(b) Retirement Plan. Starting Salary Range \$44,800 - \$56,000. Drug testing required before hire and random thereafter.

Qualifications

Master's degree in Public Health with emphasis in epidemiology or equivalent required, Master's in Biostatistics will also be considered. Two to five years related experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience. Require experience in analytical software programs i.e., SAS and SPSS. Experience working with a Native American Tribal organization and/or not-for-profit agency in epidemiology desirable. Ability to work independently and as a program team member. Individual must possess: excellent verbal and written communication skills; professional demeanor and appearance; problem solving skills; ability to manage time effectively; self-motivation skills; work effectively under pressure; speak in front of groups.

Individual must be able to address a wide range of intellectual and practical problems, apply statistical calculations to findings, and the ability to compose complex business correspondence (reports, health profiles.) Requires a high level of confidentiality. Must possess valid driver's license and/or reliable transportation with adequate insurance and ability to travel.
